Services for Individuals

All residents of the State of New Jersey are welcome to visit any one of our libraries located on Rutgers campuses in Camden, New Brunswick/Piscataway, and Newark. You are invited to browse through our stacks, ask a reference question, or use our online catalog and electronic resources. Our online catalog and selected information resources are available from our website if you are unable to visit us in person.

You may borrow materials from the Rutgers University Libraries through your local library's interlibrary borrowing service. Any resident may also apply to purchase guest borrowing privileges by completing an application for a [Community Borrower Card](#). Alumni are eligible for complimentary guest borrowing privileges and are invited to use the Rutgers Alumni Library [link: <http://www.libraries.rutgers.edu/rul/alumni/index.shtml>].

Everyone is welcome to use our extensive government publications collections. The Alexander Library (New Brunswick), the Library of Science and Medicine (Piscataway), the Dana Library (Newark), and the Paul Robeson Library (Camden) are depositories for U.S. government publications. Five libraries at Rutgers – Alexander, Dana, the Library of Science and Medicine, Robeson, and the Newark Law Library – are also depositories for New Jersey state publications. The Library of Science and Medicine is a patent depository.

The Libraries are committed to providing equal access to services and collections for all library patrons.
