Books

LSM has an extensive collection of books in Psychology. Search **IRIS**, our online catalog (<http://www.iris.rutgers.edu/iris.html>) by subject.

Find an article

Indexes and Databases tell you what journal articles have been written on a subject or by a particular author, and lead you to the most up-to-date research.

Electronic Databases: Click on “Find Articles” on the Rutgers University Libraries web page. Then select “Indexes and Databases”; all titles are accessible from on-campus computers. Rutgers current faculty, staff, and students can access these databases from off-campus; click on “Connect from Home” on the Libraries web page.

Another tool for searching the psychology literature is **Google Scholar**. Google Scholar is a free database on the web and provides access to many Rutgers full-text articles. Make sure to connect through the libraries website to **Google Scholar** for easier access to full-text articles.

Journals

LSM carries an extensive collection of journals in psychology. Print journals are shelved alphabetically by title on the 3rd floor of the library. Many journals, including **APA's PsycArticles'** titles are available online and may be accessed through **IRIS**, our online catalog. Search IRIS by Journal Title, and change the drop-down box to “Periodical Title Begins With”. Electronic journals may also be found in the “A-Z list” under “find articles” then “electronic journal lists”.
