Undergraduate Research

Structural Improvements

- Supervised the construction and ongoing maintenance of the library's on-site Automated Storage and Retrieval System (ASRS/Athena) and ingestion of 300,000 items to prepare for construction
- Supervised the buildout and renovation of 43,000 square feet of library space, including a café, fourteen study rooms, four classrooms, the Beulah Culbertson Archives and Special Collections, and the ASRS
- Established a circulating collection of 75,000 items after construction was complete

Digital and Technological Improvements

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- Oversaw the implementation of Athena Commons, a Bepress institutional repository
- Acquired ArchiveSpace and Preservica to improve archives organization and digital archiving
- Subscribed to Tipasa and RapidILL to streamline and speed up the Interlibrary Loan processes, per the library's strategic plan
